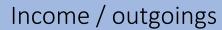








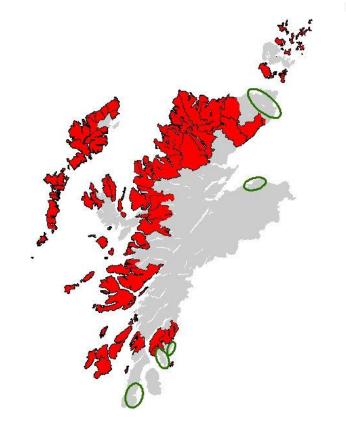

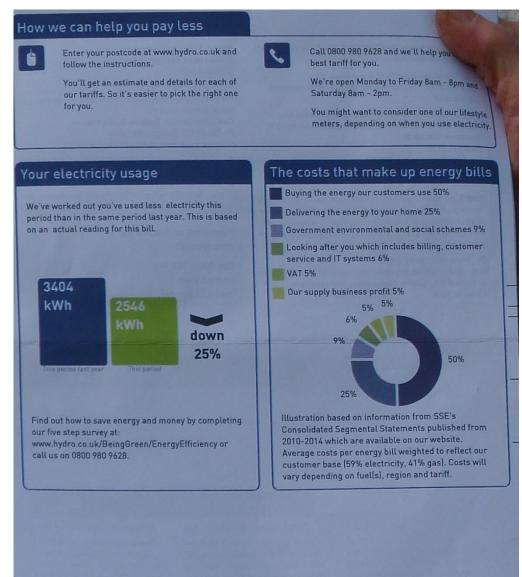


























Partnership Working with Utilities

- Ensure comfort and sustained health and wellbeing

SSE Scottish Hydro is working in partnership with The Energy Advisory Service (TEAS, based in Stornoway but work across the islands) to help customers from across the Western Isles who have an electricity debt.

Brian, Dan, Kirsty or Lorna can visit you to provide advice on using energy efficiently in your home and can check if you are entitled to any extra benefits. They can also help complete the application form for SSE Scottish Hydro's Trust Fund which will be able to help with the debt you owe and in some cases wipe it completely.

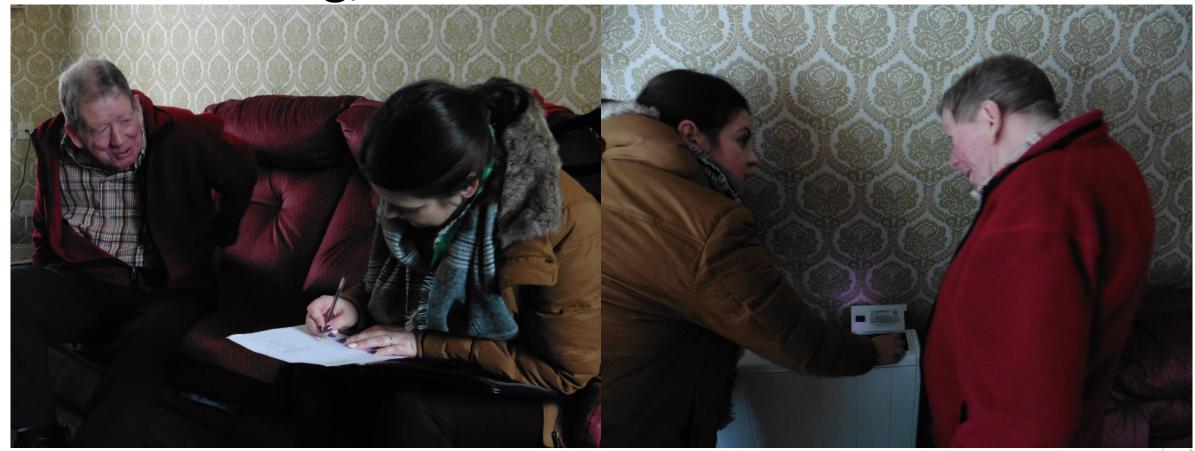

- 3 homes across the islands























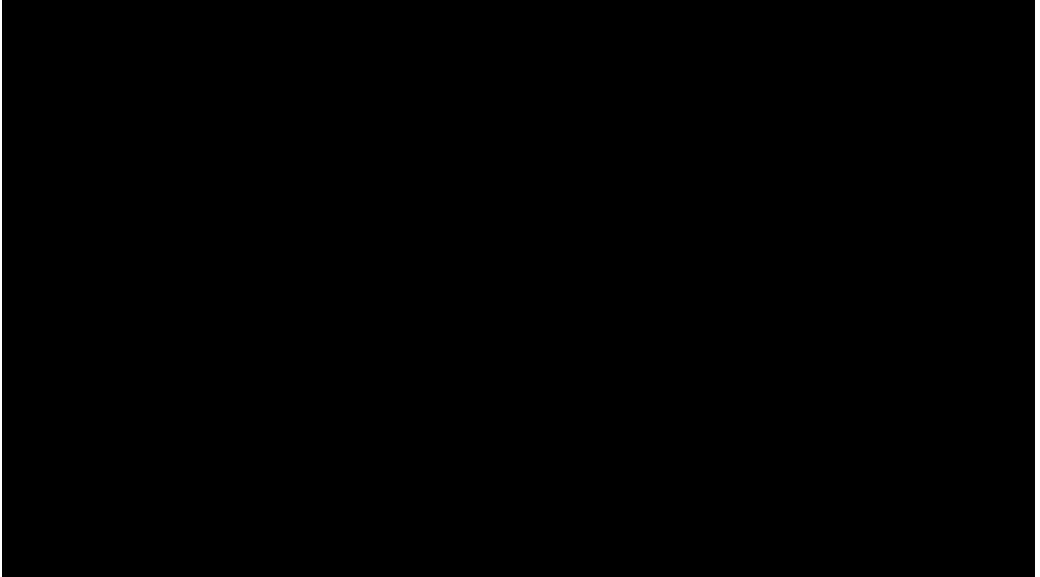
