

Second largest local authority by area in Scotland, covering nearly 10% of Scotland, and over 96% of the area is classed as 'remote rural'.





- Digital Energy Advice in Argyll and Bute








## Energy Education & Skills Development

## Case Study 1

- Mr A contacted ALlenergy as he was worried about paying for his energy bill over the winter months. The ALlenergy advisor worked with Mr A to help him understand his bill, tariff, payment options and discussed energy saving behaviour in his home.
  - Insulation measures
  - Heating replacement
  - Fire safety check and smoke alarm
  - Adaptions-hand rail
  - Priority Services Register
  - Increased chances of living independently
  - Improved comfort and confidence as Mr A can switch the heating on and live healthily in a warm home



### Case Study 2

- Mrs B's landlord contacted ALIenergy as the tenant was complaining of dampness in the flat. The ALIenergy advisor visited the property and discussed the issue of dampness and condensation in the property. On visiting the property the advisor noticed the lack of insulation.
  - Insulation measures
  - Improved understanding of causes of condensation and dampness
  - Improved relationship between landlord and tenant
  - Increased comfort levels for the tenant
  - Increased property value and future rental potential for landlord
